## Notes for performance:

Please have four Thunder Tubes located close to alto sax i, so that person can insert and remove the tubes at the appropriate points in the piece (the end of the Zwiefache).

The tubes will affect the intonation of E4 and lower, notes below C#4 may not speak properly at all, and D-E5 will also be affected, all of which is not reflected in the notation. Let the sounds fall where they may.

The form of the piece is the tuneful Zwiefache (a Bavarian dance with mixed duple and triple meters), then a Mobile in which each player stays in their own "orbit," a djent-inspired Canon with improvisation, and lastly a return to the Zwiefache.

### Mobile:

The rehearsal letters in the mobile do not line up; they are there for convenience. Alto Sax i will queue the end of the mobile after everyone is in their loop (rehearsal C). You may have a complete stop or just simply switch gears – your choice.

### Canon:

Same procedure as usual: Alto Sax i starts, when it gets to 2, Alto Sax ii starts at the beginning and so on. This section may be repeated ad libitum, ad nauseum. You may want to decide ahead of time how many times (4, 8, 16, 32, etc.) you want to repeat this section.

### Notation of fun sounds:

X notehead is a key slap (for C#5 use the three fingers in the right hand).

The upside-down lollipop/Bartok pizz is a tongue slap.

The triangle notehead high above the staff is for teeth on the reed using the fingering in the staff with the square notehead.

A notehead in parentheses is an airy or ghost note.

**First time:** Everyone holds the last note, while a sax i puts Thunder Tubes in everyone's bell. You may circular breathe or simply breathe as you need to, keep it serious or ham it up (e.g.. show impatience, grow faint, etc.), as fits the personality of the group. End the note together and then go on to the Mobile, starting together and then staying in your own orbit, as it were.

**Second time:** Everyone holds the last note, while a sax i removes everyone's Thunder Tubes. Same breathing rules apply. End the note together and await rapturous applause.
