Fine

First time: Everyone holds the last note, while a sax i puts Thunder Tubes in everyone's bell. You may circular breathe or simply breathe as you need to, keep it serious or ham it up (e.g.. show impatience, grow faint, etc.), as fits the personality of the group. End the note together and then go on to the Mobile, starting together and then staying in your own orbit, as it were.

Second time: Everyone holds the last note, while a sax i removes everyone's Thunder Tubes. Same breathing rules apply. End the note together and await rapturous applause.
